
**ORDER CORRECTING
TYPOGRAPHICAL ERROR
IN DEFAULT JUDGMENT
AND ORDER FOR
PERMANENT INJUNCTION
AND MONETARY RELIEF**

Plaintiff the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") submitted a proposed order for permanent injunction and monetary relief in this matter, and that order was signed by this Court on June 29, 2005. The order contained a typographical error in Findings Paragraph 17, which said: ". . . defendant NorVergence caused injury to consumers in the amount of at least \$172,997,758." In fact, the motion filed by the FTC, and the evidence submitted in support of that motion, all were based on an injury figure of \$181,721,914. Also, the corresponding Liquidation of Monetary Claim section of the order (Section III) correctly stated: "IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Judgment in the amount of \$181,721,914 is entered against NorVergence as restitution for consumer injury."

To correct the typographical error in Findings Paragraph 17:

IT IS ORDERED THAT the injury figure stated in Findings Paragraph 17 of the FTC's Default Judgment and Order for Permanent Injunction and Monetary Relief, as signed by this Court on June 29, 2005, be corrected to read "\$181,721,914."
