Brassfield Estate Winery – High Serenity Ranch - High Valley - Lake County

Jerry Brassfield acquired the first lands for his 2,500 acre Lake County ranch in 1973 and over time converted from cattle to vineyards. By 1998, 250 acres had been planted to 16 different varietals and the Brassfields began the development of their world class winery. High Serenity Ranch and the Brassfield Estate Winery are perched at an elevation of some 1,800 feet and dominate the High Valley Appellation, one of California's newest. Here, volcanic and alluvial soils combine with a myriad of microclimates to produce fruit with exquisite flavors and distinctive character. This is a unique estate in a fascinating new region and is well worth your ongoing attention.

2005 Brassfield Estate Serenity White - Estate

Regularly \$15.00 – Here \$13.25 - Just \$11.93 a bottle by the case

A delightful blend of 63% Sauvignon Blanc, 29% Pinot Grigio, 6% Gewurztraminer and 2% Semillon. Bright golden in color, with a touch of silver. Tropical aromas, with notes of white melon, toasted marshmallow and spicy nutmeg. Crisp acid in the entry. Refreshing. Mouthwatering. Full. White peach and nectarine flavors with creamy vanilla. Round and balanced. Lingering finish and aftertaste. Quite special.

2003 Brassfield Estate Merlot – Estate

Regularly \$19.00 – Here \$16.25 - Just \$14.63 a bottle by the case

86% Merlot, 8% Cabernet Franc and 6% Petite Verdot. An interesting blend that lives up to Merlot's reputation as a soft Cabernet. Dark ruby in color, with soft aromas of currants, blackberry, cola, cedar and sage. Concentrated, mouthwatering flavors of raspberry, black cherry and olives, with a touch of oak. Polished tannins. Long finish. Balanced, complex and quite elegant.

The Bonneau Estate

In 1921 August and Catherine Bonneau purchased 70 acres of land in the then remote area of Schelleville, a region that reminded them of the Bordeaux region of France, near where they were born. In 1989, their daughter, Yvonne planted 30 acres to Chardonnay, and in 2001, her son, John Bambury introduced their first wines. Although Bonneau also produces award winning Cabernet Sauvignon and Zinfandel, their Los Carneros Chardonnay is our focus here. Phillip Titus (Chappellet, Sonoma Loeb, Titus Vineyards) is the winemaker and the accolades are piling on. Three vintages are offered here and they are all superb.

2002 Bonneau Chardonnay – Los Carneros

Regularly \$22.00 – Here \$12.75 - Just \$11.48 a bottle by the case

Bright, dark golden color. Tropical. Pineapple, white peach and soft lemon. Toasty oak. Mouthwatering crispness. Full and rich. Mouthfilling. Tropical fruit, apple and melon. Citrus. Lovely mouthfeel. Long finish. Delicious.

2003 Bonneau Chardonnay – Private Reserve – Los Carneros

Ripe aromas of tropical fruits, with pear, white peach, fig, apricot and melon. Lively acidity. Creamy, round and sleek with succulent citrus, green apple and pineapple flavors, framed with delicate toasty oak. Vanilla bean, spice and butterscotch. Lush finish. Deeply flavored, rich and concentrated.

2004 Bonneau Chardonnay – Catherine's Vineyard – Los Carneros

Double Gold in the 2007 SF Chronicle Wine Judging. Ripe aromas of pineapple and lemon zest, with white peach and accents of toast and hazelnuts. Bright fruit. Complex and rich. Succulent citrus and tropical flavors. Delicate oak. Creamy, round texture. Lush finish. Vanilla bean.

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
